

Engaging Secondary Students in Academic Writing

Educators of students in grades 7-16 will learn concrete strategies to help scaffold academic reading and writing for all students, including English learners. This three day collaborative workshop is designed to provide practical, standards and research-based approaches to teaching students how to write better in order to ultimately improve student achievement.

Topics Covered:

- How to scaffold academic writing for all students including special needs and English learners.
- · How to scaffold writing assignments that are relevant to students' lives.
- · How to structure meaningful writing activities in a content class.
- How the California Writing Project improvement rubric can be implemented to improve academic writing instruction.

TO REGISTER:

Go to www.csustan.edu/gvwp and click on the "Calendar" link in the left hand column. Search for the opening date of the event on the calendar. Follow the on-line instructions to register.
