Fee Option #1: \$250 (for 5 sessions) (the fee for 3 or more teachers from the same site is \$200 per teacher)

Fee Option #2: Pay \$55 per session and attend only the sessions of your choice. The first session is mandatory for all participants.

• If you attend the first day and decide to attend all five sessions, you can purchase it for the regular price (\$250 instead of increased \$275). The first day will be the last chance to change to fee option#1.

· Participants cannot earn graduate credit unless they attend all five sessions

· Participants will not receive the ISAW rubric unless they attend all five sessions

· Participants will not receive the selected books unless they attend all five sessions
